

The floor plan was to be open and free and designed to take maximum advantage of north sunlight, thus making it solar efficient, whilst taking full advantage of views to the parkland at the rear of the site.

Some of the energy design principles achieved include north facing glass in daytime rooms to allow for winter sun; insulated concrete floor; some verandah protection on the western elevation. 
This is not a spectactular home by any stretch however it meets the client's design brief for this very tight site with a very fine view. The Designer achieved his goal - another satisfied client!

The home had to offer visual interest, provide separation of major living areas, and allow privacy and independent access for the older children. Parents required a separate suite. Multi car accommodation, in-ground pool and spa plus tennis court completed the client's brief.

The finished design uses several techniques to create subtle variation in height and shape. Its form links all areas, horizontally through vertically, and by the creative use of void spaces. Attention to planning details is a feature of all rooms and areas.



Project: To design a weather protected outside deck and spa to enhance the existing kitchen and meals area at a Mulgrave house. The extension utilises a subtle yet creative blend of materials and finishes in a strikingly efficient manner. A triangular addition to the family room provides valuable extra space, creating a direct link to a floor level timber deck via sliding doors. Usage throughout the year is achieved by twin wall polycarbonate roofing above the sitting area.

A clear glass roof above the spa offers bathers a view to the heavens. Walls of glass and louvres protect from the elements, yet bring the garden up to the deck.

of finishes and visual contact with extensive adjoining landscaping. The facility provides the staff with comfort and visual interest away from manufacturing areas. Smokers have not been discriminated, as they have a smoke crib attached for their own use. The canteen, which functions 24 hours every day, 52 weeks a year, is logistically placed, and is extremely comfortable.
