

SPECTACULAR WAREHOUSE CONVERSION

This warehouse renovation, designed by Peter Jackson of Peter Jackson Design Consultants in Melbourne, utilised natural light to enhance the design of both the central living area and the library on the mezzanine level. Skylights were used because the building only had windows at the front and back and light was needed in the centre of the room.

Peter chose VELUX over traditional plastic skylights because he needed products that performed well thermally and created excellent ventilation throughout the building. Double glazed, Low-E coated skylights were the only possible alternative, particularly as a pyrotechnics heating system that radiates heat down into the living area was being used. As Peter commented, "from that point of view, we increase the insulation with double glazing and help stop the heat escaping back out through the glass."





"We wanted to follow through with the whole package, not just the double glazing, but noise insulation as well. VELUX glazing panes reduce noise by 29db", said Peter.
