to design him a modern masterpiece that woul complement its beachside location.

Using a mix of strikingly dynamic shapes, lind and colours, a distinctly modern edge was give to the external structure of the home. This modern feel was continued throughout the interior with the continued use of interesting curves and shapes.

From the moment you enter the home throug the angled doorway, you are struck by it distinct contemporary charm. The main enter passage leads into the home's formal living are where an open staircase leads to the upstail sector. Space has been used to maximum potential with an innovative bar bein ingeniously encompassed underneath the stair. Highlight box windows fill the room with light while its open-plan design allows it to spill ou onto a rear undercover courtyard.

Extending from the living area is a state-of-the art kitchen complete with curved island bench Ceramic floor tiles, glass-fronted cupboards an granite benchtops create a slick streamline look in keeping with the overall contemporar theme. Full-length glass windows allow a abundance of light to flow into the space an also fully utilise the home's magnificen seascape, allowing views to be captured from every available angle.

One of the main considerations for the owner was maximising the views, so both the home' living areas and bedrooms have been carefull positioned towards the front and rear of the house to take advantages of the idyllic outlook. Two of the three bedrooms have been purposefully located on opposite areas of the



ground-floor level, allowing both guests and the family privacy. The first of these bedrooms features a walk-in robe and ensuite but its most distinctive feature would have to be its sloping feature wall and amazing downstairs ocean views. The second downstairs bedroom has been positioned at the rear of the home with views over the back courtyard area. The master suite is located upstairs and boasts extensive ocean views through its numerous highlight windows. By positioning the main suite on the upstairs level, a restful retreat haven has been created. The master suite opens onto an extensive deck which allows out and indoors to merge. A stunning ensuite bathroom and truly eye-catching sitting room complete this main suite retreat.

Without a doubt one of this home's most distinctive elements would have to be the butt-glassed triangular cantilevered effect that creates a stunning result in the upstairs living space and without which the overall contemporary edge would not work so well. This home is masterfully completed with the inclusion of a three-car garaging space and boat storage area on the ground floor.

The house is now a bed and breakfast and recently won the Building Designers Association of Victoria Best Residential Design of a Project Home 301-400sqm, one of 47 building and design awards won by Peter and Steve over the past eight years.
